## LCAP & Title I Overview

### LCAP with Title I Schoolwide Program Embedded

- Increase academic performance.
  - Title I: Intervention programs and personnel to support students.
  - Students will gain skills for college or career readiness.
- Increase student retention.
  - Title I: Helping Homeless Students

### Title I Program Purpose

- Improve academic achievement for English Language Learners, foster youth, and low-income students.
- Implement a well-rounded instructional program to meet the academic needs of all students.

### Title I Program Evaluation for the 2021-2022 School Year

- What worked and why in 2021-2022?
  - 229 Title I Targeted Assistant Students were identified for Literacy Intervention Support; 2,883 students completed the NWEA Reading; 203 was the Average Reading Lexile Score for the 21-22 Targeted Assistant Students served.
- What didn't work and why in 2021-2022?
  - Based on the feedback from students and teachers, 463 intervention credits were completed by 140 Target Assistant Students; The remaining 38% Target Assistant Students did not complete an intervention program.
- For 2022-2023...
  - SDWIHS recommends extending the intervention outreach services and student engagement efforts to increase student participation in an intervention program; The school will provide individualized support for students to achieve their goals.

### Guiding Question #1: The Title I school allocates Title I funds to support Intervention programs and personnel.

- What worked and why in 2021-2022
  - SDWIHS provides parents with vital information in English and Spanish at PAC/ELAC meetings, as evidenced by agendas, sign-in sheets, and minutes. The evidence showed 295 participants for 21-22; 155 parents/guardians completed the Annual Surveys; The annual survey showed that 73% of parents/guardians feel encouraged to participate.
- What didn't work and why in 2021-2022?
  - Although important information was provided during the PAC/ELAC meetings, not all parents understood the data, as evidenced by parent/guardian survey results and feedback during the meetings; Parent/guardian attendance was low at PAC/ELAC because meeting date/time. announcements need improvement; Parent/guardian survey completion was lower than anticipated.
- For 2022-2023

- Provide additional time during PAC/ELAC meetings to explain any questions families may have from the meetings; Provide meetings on different days/times so more parents/guardians can attend; Continue to reach out to parents through various platforms to increase participation and offer different activities during the meetings.
