b. <u>Education Compact:</u> We support youth homelessness. Students that need housing or into the work force. We also support youth with their goal to attend a college. We also connect with probation youths and guide them to a positive path. And try to encourage them with resources like counseling, mental awareness, and self-courage.

#### c. Workforce development opportunities:

- Jackson: We own a boxing gym and we build relationships with students male and females. We teach these students disciplines and physical fitness. We also hire our students after they completed the program and we have them as our fight team, front desk, etc. Erick: I'm one of the trainers and I used to be one of their students. Boxing has teached me confidence, focus, and helped me to focus on myself. We will be seeing if we can have this program to start here with Innovation High School. This program also helps with our students that are ages from 19 up to 24 with their enrollment with our school.

### - SGI Class with ALgebra:

Mrs. Flores will be running in depth with this class to help students with enhanced structure of math from 11:00AM to 1:00PM. So far all students have been enjoying it and have been asking a lot of questions! We noticed the difference with this class to our students and we will continue to provide this class for future years to come!

#### - CNA Program:

We just finished our Spring CNA program and you can see our group that just completed the first session on site. This program helps students become certified to become a certified nursing assistant.
