- IV. Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) and Direct Technical Assistance (DTA)
- a. CSI (Comprehensive Support & Improvement):
 - It is a federal program that gives schools support and resources to help improve student success.
 - b. CSI supports school improvement by:

 - Offering additional resources and support
 - Focusing on increasing academic success and graduation rates

 - All English learner students must take the test on campus.
 - As a public school we must reach 95% of all "EL" students to test.
