 - a. Mid-Year LCAP Report.
 1. Increase in tutoring, increased by 177% since last meeting
 - b. Review Focus Goal.
 1. Increase Academic Progress
 - a) Students need to turn in at least one credit a week.
 - b) SGI classes are available - History, Math, SLAM, Biology
 - c) Tutoring -We have tutors available to students in person every day
 - d) How can we get your student to turn in one more credit per week?
 2. Increase Student Attendance
 - a) Students must attend 2x per week for 2 hours each time
 - b) Our student retention support team will contact students when they are not attending regularly to help reengage them in school.
 - c) How can we get students to consistently attend 2 scheduled appointments?
